Once again, another year is closing. For many it has been a year of challenge, with household budgets stretched thin with rising costs and taxes.

In addition to my Public Land Management and Aboriginal Affairs Shadow responsibilities, I have been entrusted with the Outdoor Recreation portfolio.

These portfolios enabled me to travel across Victoria championing access to public land, traditional recreational pastimes and our vision for tackling disadvantage and governing for all Victorians equally.

### Championing rural fairness

As Shadow Minister for Public Land Management and Outdoor Recreation, I've been championing practical policies.

I led debate opposing the Parks and Public Land Legislation Amendment Bill, calling for balanced measures that protect bush user access.

In Parliament, I fought to safeguard frontline Fisheries Officers and pressed for licencing renewal systems that ensure regional hunters aren't disadvantaged by digital only processes.

With less than a year until the 2026 state election, The Nationals are strong in our resolve for a fresh start as the Allan Government continues to fail regional Victorians.

### Remembrance Day 2025

As a Nationals MP, it's an honour to commemorate those who served and sacrificed for our freedoms. On November 11, communities attended local RSL services in moving tributes of courage and resilience.

I was privileged to join the unveiling of a plaque honouring Private William 'Bill' Mathews, who fought with the 22nd Battalion at Bullecourt in WWI. The plaque is as a lasting tribute to his service and sacrifice. I thank the Phillip Island RSL for their dedication.

Our RSLs are vital in preserving this legacy and supporting veterans for generations to come.



### Bushfire preparedness

I've raised urgent concerns in Parliament and the media about Victoria's fire preparedness. With a high risk summer ahead, our state remains underprepared. Over 300 Forest Fire Management trucks remain grounded, forcing the Allan Government to borrow decommissioned vehicles from interstate.

Fuel reduction is dangerously behind schedule, with only 1 percent of public land treated despite the Bushfires Royal Commission's 5 percent target. CFA and SES volunteers face ageing equipment and limited support, while families and farmers are hit with higher costs under Labor's new Emergency Services Tax – a tax The Nationals will scrap in government.

We will keep fighting for fleet readiness, credible fuel reduction programs and properly resourced emergency services. Please take time to prepare your property and review your fire plan this summer.

## Newhaven Jetty win!

After 18 months of community action and Nationals advocacy, we forced the government to commit state funding for a major upgrade and reopening of the Newhaven Jetty.

The community never gave up on saving this historic jetty – a much loved, accessible fishing platform. Together with residents, we launched petitions and held rallies to expose Labor's refusal to listen or act, ensuring this beautiful public jetty wasn't lost forever.

## Phillip Island Road safety



The Allan Government has failed to deliver critical upgrades to Phillip Island Road at San Remo, despite years of mounting safety concerns and advocacy.

The RACV ranks this road among Victoria's most dangerous, with worsening congestion compromising safety and liveability. Despite being Bass Coast's top road priority and shovel ready for over a decade, it continues to be ignored.
